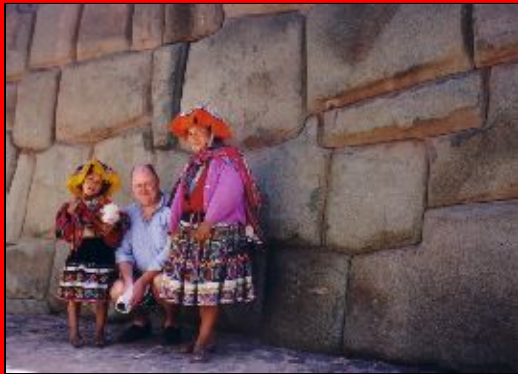
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Cusco – Peru

Scotland and the South West of England have been supporting the programme since the very early days of Salsa parties back in 2001 . Schools in the UK benefit by learning about life in the Andes.



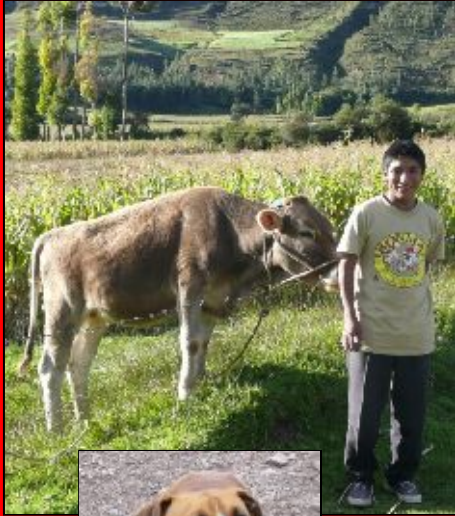
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Animals

Going to the local school in Oropesa means the boys are beginning to learn once again. They have new friends and we are starting to help those schools develop their educational provision.



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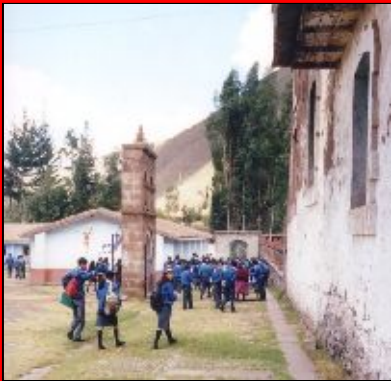
